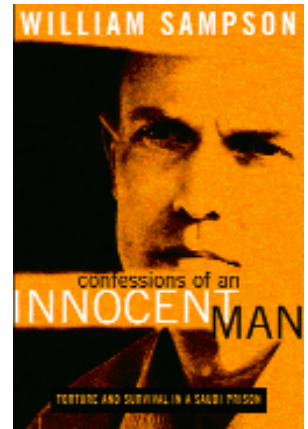


**Starlight Tour**  
**The Last, Lonely Night of Neil Stonechild**

In 1990, on a November night that hit -28 degrees Celsius, seventeen-year-old Neil Stonechild disappeared only blocks from his mother's home; his frozen body was found three days later. Reports of a sighting of Stonechild beaten and bleeding in the back of a police car the night he disappeared were discounted, even amongst rumours that police sometimes drove natives beyond the edge of town and abandoned them. In 2000, two more men were found frozen to death; a third survived his "starlight tour" and lived to tell of it. This is a tale of rogue cops, racism, obstruction of justice, and justice denied.

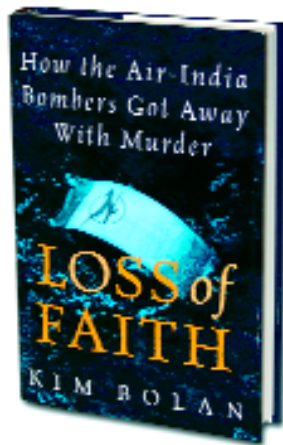


**Confessions of an Innocent Man**
